A Brief History

Health Care Center for the Homeless, Inc. (HCCH) is a 501(c)3 organization founded by Dr. Rick Baxley in 1993. By bringing together a group of volunteer medical providers, Dr. Baxley initiated primary medical care services out of one small room at a local homeless shelter and additional programs were added as the organization grew. In 2001, HCCH began serving low-income housed but uninsured patients in an effort to prevent a potential decline into homelessness resulting from overwhelming medical costs. In 2006 HCCH opened the first Orange Blossom Family Health location and brought all programs under one roof. With a diverse staff of caring providers HCCH now offers care in Orange, Osceola and Seminole Counties through our main location, five Orange Blossom Family Health satellite sites and mobile medical and dental units.

Health Care Center for the Homeless, Inc. (HCCH) has been caring for our underserved community members for 23 years. In 2015, we served 15,931 unduplicated patients, of which 5,807 were homeless.

While we can deliver the best health care possible for our homeless patients, until they are housed their health will be compromised. When it comes down to it, housing is health care.

I am excited about what is happening in our community right now - excited that we have taken those first steps towards truly addressing the issue of chronic homelessness. Housing First is here and it is making a difference in the lives of people who have spent years on the streets, existing without hope of ever being able to exit homelessness. We have stopped stepping around the problem and are facing it head on, improving our community and the quality of life here as we go.

To think it is as simple as providing someone who is homeless with...a home. Once they are in their home, supportive services are wrapped around them to help them live healthier and more productive lives. I am proud that HCCH is playing a crucial role in this process. From our outreach team to our case managers to our many health programs, we are housing our chronically homeless neighbors and improving their health status. Please take the time to read the Housing First overview located in the center of this Report for more details on this amazing program. This project was made possible by a grant from the Homeless Impact Fund at the Central Florida Foundation and I am grateful for their commitment to this crucial issue.

Since last fall, some of our most vulnerable homeless community members have been housed through this program and remain housed. We have a long way to go but each journey starts with those first steps. We hope to reach a point that when someone falls into homelessness, the solution may be as simple as writing a prescription for one unit of housing.

Thank you for the confidence you have shown in our efforts over the past 23 years. I look forward to working side by side with all of you for many years to come.

Housing Is

Housing First

Launched in Orlando in the fall of 2015, Housing First has proven successful around the county in addressing the issue of chronic homelessness. This model houses a chronically homeless client first and wraps supportive services around them, averaging an 80% success rate. This compares to roughly 20% in the past when homeless individuals would be required to address any addiction or behavioral health issues before they could potentially access housing. After completing a treatment program, they would return to the unsheltered situation that created or aggravated their issue while waiting for a housing opportunity. This created

a vicious cycle that often ended up with the client giving up hope that their living situation would ever improve. Housing First is changing this and Health Care Center for the Homeless, Inc. inhabits some key roles: our HOPE Team identifies their unsheltered homeless clients most at risk of dying on the streets; our case managers assist with access to housing and supportive services; and our Orange Blossom Family Health locations are a main health resource. The goal for the first year is to house 100 of our most vulnerable chronically homeless community members – as of this printing, 70 clients have been housed.

A Client's Story

When you meet Barbara, it's hard to imagine that this feisty little 60 year old woman was homeless for two years. She'd always had a roof over her head and food on the table until a few years ago. She gave up her place in Orlando to move in with her disabled brother in Kissimmee and be his sole caretaker. When her brother had to be moved into a nursing home, Barbara found herself on the street with nothing and no place to go. She spent many frightening months sleeping in parks, in local shelters and with friends when possible. This all changed when she met Raul, an outreach specialist with the HOPE Team

at Health Care Center for the Homeless, who connected Barbara with Housing First and her case manager Warren. In November of 2015 she was escorted into her new home filled with furniture, food and household items provided through collaborations with other agencies and faith based organizations. Barbara is addressing her hypertension and other health concerns and moving forward day by day. In her words, “If it wasn't for Raul and Warren, I don't know where I would be. It takes a while...but you can get up on your feet again.”

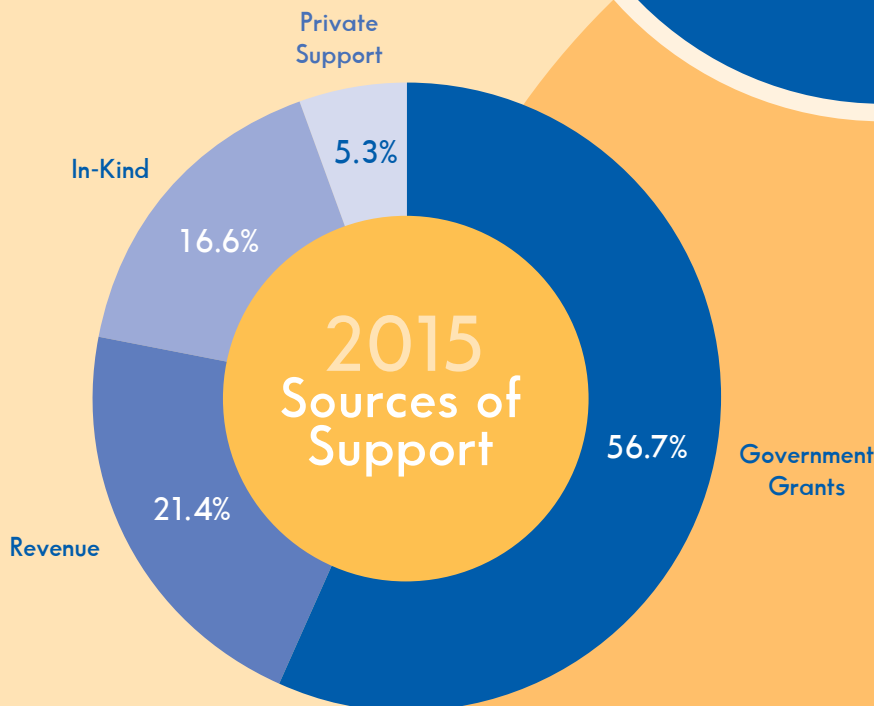
